- Ought (Strong's G1163) i.e. Needs, Should. It is not a requirement.
- And not to Faint (Strong's G1573) i.e. Weak, Weary.

A Bad Judge

18:2 Saying, There was in a city a judge, which feared not God, neither regarded man:

Our Judge Is different

18:6 And the Lord said, Hear what the unjust judge saith.

18:7 And shall not God avenge his own elect, which cry day and night unto him, though he bear long with them?

18:8 I tell you that he will avenge them speedily. Nevertheless when the Son of man cometh, shall he find faith on the earth?



Our Boldness Rewarded

Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need. Heb. 4:16

- Therefore we should never grow discouraged, but come to Him again and again, remembering that He is never weary of our coming and that He will not turn us away empty. R5966

- Most Growth comes by Knowledge and Trial.
 - Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean: wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.
 Make me to hear joy and gladness; [that] the bones [which] thou hast broken may rejoice.
 Hide thy face from my sins, and blot out all mine iniquities.
 Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me.
 Cast me not away from thy presence; and take not thy holy spirit from me.

We should have Sympathy for those in Authority

Prayer : God give them wisdom as he see fit.

I Tim 2:1,2

2:1 I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, intercessions, [and] giving of thanks, be made for all men;

2:2 For kings, and [for] all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty. .

For what are we to pray?

Temporalities should be presented in a casual way. We should have the desire to subsist in such a manner as would be pleasing to the Lord and should be thankful for whatever His providence may give us--whether much or little. R5200

It has been suggested that to pray for anything which God is *willing to give* is entirely proper. We may pray for the Holy Spirit, for more love, more gentleness, more patience, more wisdom from on High. We may pray that all these things will work together for our good; for He has promised that this shall be. We may pray for guidance from the Lord as may be best in His sight. But we may not *tell Him what to do;* for we have no means of knowing what is His will in matters in general.
